Homily

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven:
by the power of the Holy Spirit
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

I ask your prayers for God's people throughout the world; for our Bishops: Justin of Canterbury, Michael our Presiding Bishop and Chip our diocesan; for this gathering; and for all ministers and people. Pray for the Church. *Silence*

I ask your prayers for peace; for goodwill among nations; and for the well-being of all people. Pray for justice and peace. *Silence*

I ask your prayers for the poor, the sick, the hungry, the oppressed, and those in prison. During this time of global illness, we especially pray for those who have this virus and all those who care for them in any way and for the anxiety of society. May we care for one another even as Jesus cared for all. Pray for those in any need or trouble.

Silence

I ask your prayers for all who seek God, or a deeper knowledge of him. Pray that they may find and be found by him. *Silence*

I ask your prayers for the departed. Pray for those who have died. *Silence*

Please offer your own intercessions for others at this time. *Silence*

Please offer your thanksgivings at this time, counting your many blessings, naming them one by one. *Silence*

Praise God for those in every generation in whom Christ has been honored, giving thanks for this parish of St. Martin's and our fellowship within it. We pray for the day we may all be reunited to share the Holy Eucharist together and that we remain steadfast in faith and prayer until that day. Pray that we may have grace to glorify Christ in our own day.

The Officiant adds a concluding collect.

Lord, even when we are separated from one another physically, we give thanks that we are one body with you in prayer. Receive the

prayers we have offered on this day and grant us the gift of your Spirit as we move into this holy week in your name. *Amen*.

During this unusual time, we refrain from offering the Sacrament of the Eucharist as a way of caring for the world.
