A Reading from the Book of Joshua (1:1-9)

After the death of Moses the servant of the Lord, the Lord spoke to Joshua son of Nun, Moses' assistant, saying, 'My servant Moses is dead. Every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given to you, as I promised to Moses.
