

Penitential Rite As we prepare to celebrate the mystery of God's love, revealed in Word and Sacrament, let us call to mind our sins.

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor. (Please kneel. Silence) Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen*.



Collect O God, you made us all in your own image and redeemed us through Jesus your Son: Look with compassion on the whole human family; take away the arrogance and hatred which infect our hearts; break down the walls that separate us; unite us in bonds of love; and work through our struggle and confusion to accomplish your purposes on earth; that, in your good time, all people may serve you in harmony; through Jesus Christ our Savior. *Amen.*

Thus says the Lord: Maintain justice, and do what is right, for soon my salvation will come and my deliverance be revealed. Happy is the mortal who does this, the one who holds it fast, who keeps the Sabbath, not profaning it, and refrains from doing any evil. Do not let the foreigner joined to the Lord say, "The Lord will surely separate me from his people," and do not let the eunuch say, "I am just a dry tree."

For thus says the Lord: To the eunuchs who keep my Sabbaths, who choose the things that please me and hold fast my covenant, I will give, in my house and within my walls, a monument and a name better than sons and daughters; I will give them an everlasting name that shall not be cut off.

And the foreigners who join themselves to the Lord, to minister to him, to love the name of the Lord, and to be his servants, all who keep the Sabbath and do not profane it and hold fast my covenant— these I will bring to my holy mountain and make them joyful in my house of prayer; their burnt offerings and their sacrifices will be accepted on my altar, for my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples.

Thus says the Lord God, who gathers the outcasts of Israel: I will gather others to them besides those already gathered. The Word of the Lord. *Thanks be to God*.

In you, O God, have I taken refuge; let me never be put to shame;

A Reading from Galatians

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another.

Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious:


fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

The Nicene Creed

Please stand

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give God thanks and praise.

It is truly right to praise you, Fountain of life and Source of all being, through Jesus Christ our Savior, through whom we are all accepted as members of your beloved community. Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we lift our voices in one chorus of praise as we sing:



Please continue standing or kneel as you are able.

Most Holy God, you loved us from before time, and made us in your image to show the beauty of your glory in the world. You called us your children and welcomed us into your family. But we would not share the love that had been given to us. We rejected those who were different from us, and excluded those we believed to be unworthy of your love.

Yet, you did not abandon us: You sent Jesus, your Eternal Word, born of the Holy Spirit and our sister Mary, to reveal our true humanity, to reconcile us to you and to one another, and to call us to return to the way of love. Jesus befriended outcasts and welcomed the stranger, and with a love stronger than death, embraced us all with your compassionate mercy and liberating grace.

On the night before Jesus suffered with us, he took bread, gave you thanks, and said, "this is my body which is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper had ended, Jesus took a cup of wine. Again he gave you thanks and praise, and said, "this is my blood which is shed for you. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Therefore, we offer you, O Merciful One, this bread and this cup as we proclaim the mystery of faith: *Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again*.

Send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be for us the life giving body and blood of our Savior Jesus Christ, and grant that all who share in these holy mysteries may receive the fullness of the Holy Spirit, that we may be strengthened as members of the body of Christ to work for justice and peace in the world.

And at the last day, gather us with the Most Blessed Mother of God, with St. Mary Magdalene and all the apostles, with Saints Sergius and Bacchus, Saints Felicity and Perpetua and all the holy martyrs, with St. Aelred of Rievaulx, Blessed Madre Juana de la Cruz and all your saints, into that place, where beholding the splendor of your radiance, we will dwell in the eternal bliss of your love.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory are yours, O loving Creator, Mother and Father of us all, for ever and ever. *AMEN*.

Image on the Cover:

The image on the cover is an icon of Sts. Serguis and Bacchus, who are the patron saints of same-sex married couples. While it would be incorrect for us to think of them as a married gay couple in the way that we know those kinds of loving relationships today, (given the vast cultural distance between understandings of same-sex behavior then and now, it's misguided to try to "discover" explicit affirmations of same-sex couples or LGBTQ people in the Bible or in church history), it is clear from their hagiograhies that thet shared a deep and intimate love. One of the most ancient icons of them presents them as a "married couple", being united by Christ.

Many of the saints honored in the Eucharistic prayer might have also identified as LGBT had they lived in modern times.
