


Antiphon: For God alone my soul in silence waits..

The Annual Meeting

Minutes from the 2023 Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of St Martin's Church was opened at 11:40 am following the post communion prayer.

Candidates Debra Mock, for School Board President and Anne Marie Verdiramo for the open vestry position, were both elected by acclamation.

Senior warden, Larry Ottenstroer encouraged all to participate in parish activities. Beth Hixenbaugh, junior warden, listed some property issues that have been addressed, including tree removal and replacement of the HVAC system. She also proposed an "Adopt a Garden" project to maintain the church grounds.

Treasurer, Chris Evans, gave the financial report. There was about a \$46,000 loss which was less than expected. Revenue was down about \$7,000. He also suggested a study to create a capital reserve fund for unexpected major expenses.

The budget for 2023 includes clergy and insurance costs that are determined by the Diocese. Insurance costs are up 10%. A rise in utility expenses was also included.

Juanita Hawkins praised Chris for his outstanding work.

The meeting was concluded at 12 pm.

St. Martin's School operates as a not-for-profit organization in the church facilities. The school is a subsidiary of St. Martin's Episcopal Church and one of the largest missions of the church. Infant through kindergarten aged children are accepted. A combination of the Montessori method and the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd are used in guiding and teaching the children.
