


"The righteous care for the needs of their animals." – Proverbs 12:10

The Pet Memorial Garden is a consecrated place on church grounds where families may lovingly place their pets' ashes, finding comfort in prayer and remembrance."

Saint Martin's provides a beautiful tranquil setting on church grounds for the spreading or interment of your beloved pet's ashes.

Interment requires a bio-degradable urn or box. There will be a \$50 fee for interment of ashes.

There is no fee for scattering of ashes. A suggested donation of \$100 supports garden upkeep and ministry.



Every year, on or around Oct. 4th we celebrate the Feast of St. Francis. We invite families to join us in a outdoor ceremony to bless their pets and honor the pets laid to rest in our garden. It's a time to reflect, share, and find comfort in a community that understands.
